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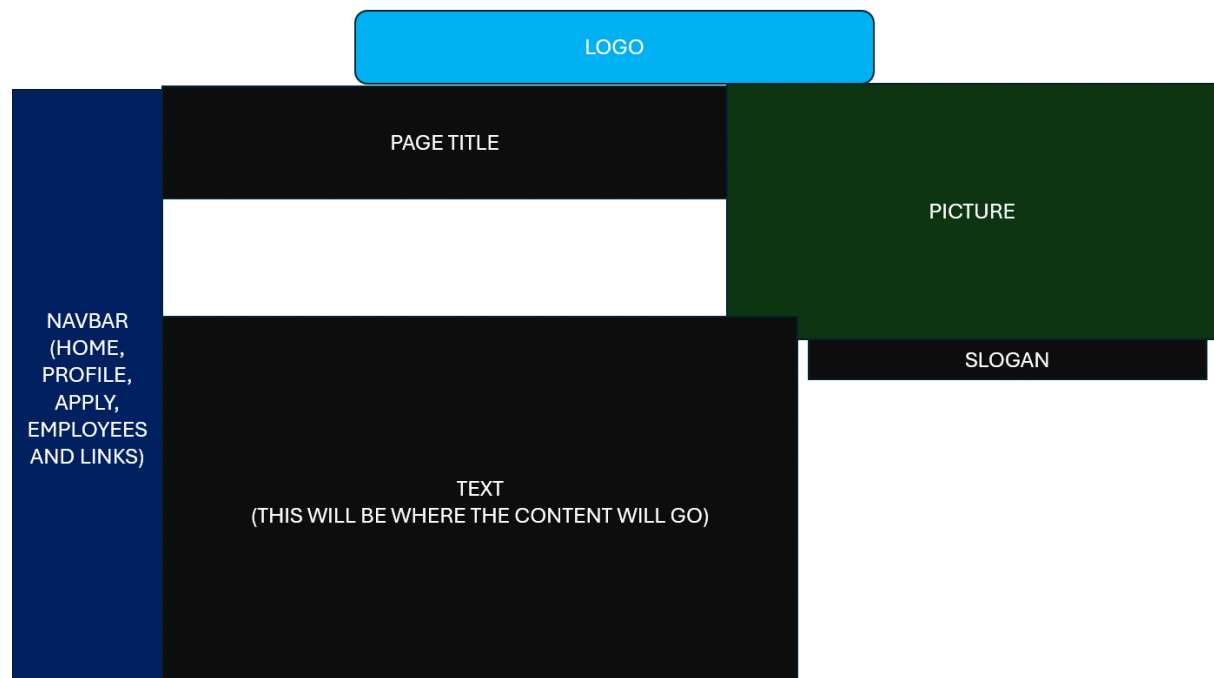
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Introduction

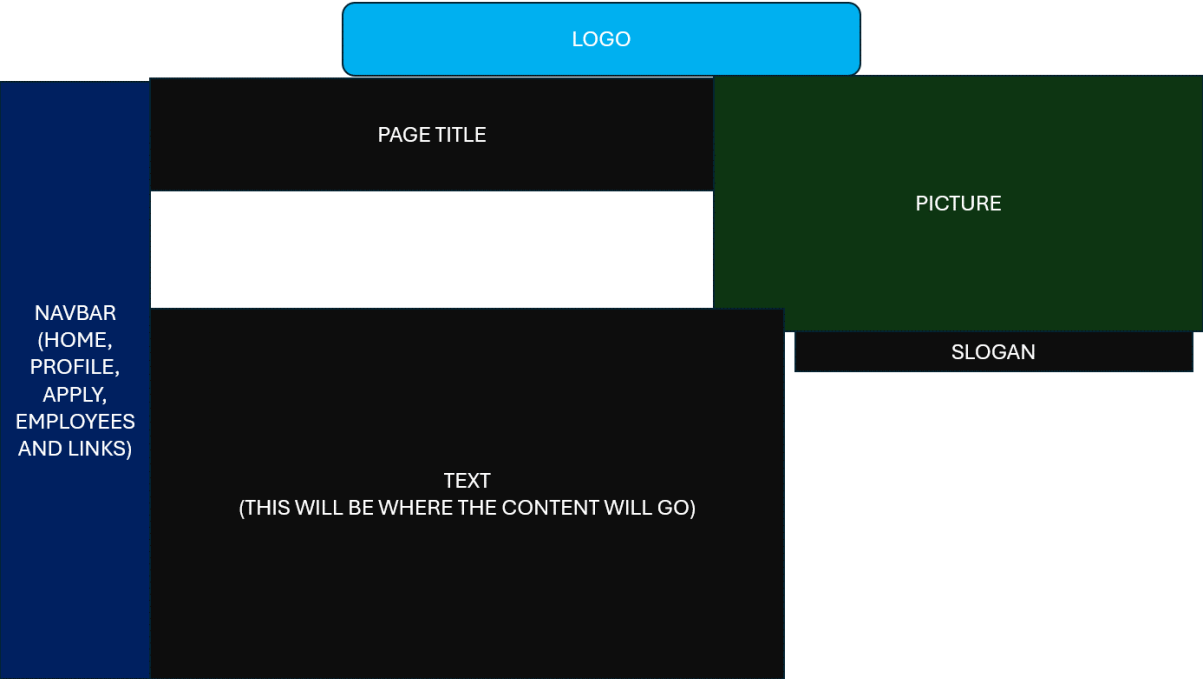

"Personally, I think your wireframes are not fit for purpose for the target audience. Firstly, there is a lot of 'white-space' within your designs making your website look less appealing to the user! Some of the text is overlapping the images and this can be affected by the image itself and then the users will not be appealed to the text as its overlaying and hard to see. Slogan is wrongly positioned as it should be underneath the logo on only the home page or at a start of a website"

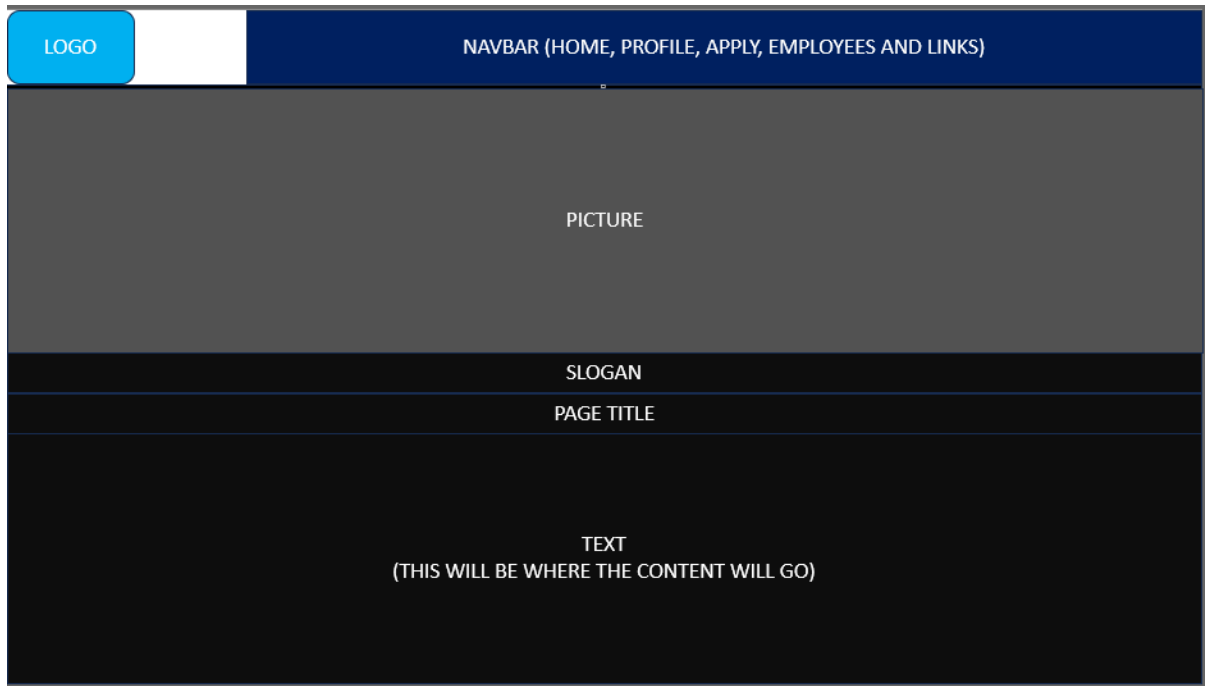
only. The navigation bar should be located at the top of the website unless specified to be a 'hamburger menu' as all typical website design models always position their navigation bar at the top of each webpage.”

The information is cluttered, with no uniformity, the navigation bar being on the left hand side is unconventional, meaning the website will be difficult to navigate and the presentation of information is ineffective, this could become frustrating for the user, as the design is cluttered so you'll get overload of information.
